Studying at the Charité: study options

Clinical rotations

One option to study at Charité is completing clinical rotations (German = "Famulatur"). These are fulltime clinical placements which take place on the hospital wards. The usual amount of time spent on the ward is about 8 hours per day. The common working hours are from 8 am till 4 pm. The students will work on the ward under the supervision of a physician. Depending on the subject a minimum duration of 2 to 4 weeks is required. You can choose out of a vast variety of different clinical disciplines as well as very specialized fields. In the following we compiled an overview in what fields you can do clinical rotations in. If you desire to spend a rotation in a particular field which is not in the list please do not hesitate to contact us. The training will take place in the clinical departments of Charité as well as in its affiliated teaching hospitals in the Berlin-Brandenburg region. Please bring your own stethoscope, diagnostic tools etc.

To get the most out of your clinical experience at Charité we recommend our students to be fluent in German as this is the main language of communication. Although many doctors are able to speak and understand English, patient normally do not. However, in some clinical disciplines proficiency in German is absolutely mandatory. This applies especially to subjects with high level of doctor-patient interaction. To get enrolled in these clinical rotations we need a proof of your language proficiency in German. We accept TestDAF, Goethe certificates and we also offer you the opportunity to test your language skills online (Einstufungstest) via the following URL:
